LTC Michael B. Bailey was assigned the Deputy Commander of Fort Hunter Liggett in July 2014, assumed Command in November serving as Interim Garrison Commander for eight months, and reverted back to Deputy Commander in July 2015. Prior to this assignment, LTC Bailey was the Force Development Plans Officer of the U.S. Army Civil Affairs and Psychological Operations Command (Airborne), at Fort Bragg, NC.

LTC Bailey is a native of Sharpsburg, North Carolina and earned his commission through the Reserve Officer Training Corps at East Carolina University, where he earned a Bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice, was a Distinguished Military Graduate, and received a Regular Army Commission in the Military Police Corps. LTC Bailey began his Army career as a Direct Support Platoon Leader with the 2<sup>nd</sup> Military Police Company, 2<sup>nd</sup> Infantry Division, at Camp Casey, Korea.

His active-duty Regular Army assignments include various platoon leader positions at Camp Casey, Korea and at Fort Bragg, NC, and Assistant Battalion S-4, 503<sup>rd</sup> Military Police Battalion (Airborne) of the 16<sup>th</sup> Military Police Brigade (Airborne) at Fort Bragg, NC. His active-duty Reserve assignments include Crisis Action Team Officer of the Headquarters Department of the Army Operations Center at Pentagon, Washington DC from Oct. 2002 to Sept. 2003; Assistant Battalion S-3 of the 425<sup>th</sup> Civil Affairs Battalion at Santa Barbara, CA from Sept. 2003-Jul. 2006; G-3 CENTCOM Operations Officer from Jul. 2006 to Jan. 2007, Aide de Camp from Jan. 2007 to Feb. 2008, and Special Assistant to the Commanding General from Feb. 2008 to Apr. 2008 of the U.S. Army Civil Affairs and Psychological Operations Command (Airborne) at Fort Bragg, NC; Civil Military Operations Center Chief of the 432<sup>nd</sup> Civil Affairs Battalion at Sadr City, Iraq from Apr. 2008 to Jun. 2008; Battalion S-3 Operations Chief of the 489<sup>th</sup> Civil Affairs Battalion at Knoxville, TN from Jun. 2008 to Aug. 2009; Commander, Headquarters and Headquarters Company of the 352<sup>nd</sup> Civil Affairs Command at Fort Meade, MD from Oct. 2010 to Mar. 2012; Commander, Charlie Company of the 414<sup>th</sup> Civil Affairs Battalion at Southfield, MI from Mar. 2012 to Jul. 2012; and G-3/9 Chief of Readiness of the U.S. Army Civil Affairs and Psychological Operations Command (Airborne) at Fort Bragg, NC from Jul. 2012 to Jan. 2014.
