Fort Hunter Liggett is the largest Army Reserve installation and the eighth largest in the Army. With more than 165,000 acres of unencroached mountains, valleys, rivers, plains, and forests it provides ideal maneuver areas for today's CS/CSS training requirements.


The Combat Support Training Center - MISSION

Established in October 2005, the U.S. Army Combat Support Training Center (CSTC) - West provides base operations support at four installations enabling world-class Combat Support/ Combat Service Support (CS/CSS) training, while providing for the well-being and security of Soldiers, Family Members, and Civilian on post.

The CSTC-West encompasses four unique, diverse, and geographically dispersed Army installations located in the northern and central part of the state. The headquarters at Fort Hunter Liggett (South Monterey) oversees the base operations, training facilities, and housing assets of Fort Hunter Liggett (FHL) and Camp Parks (Dublin). It also provides military housing at the Army Complex at Moffett Field (Mountain View), and lodging and dining facilities at the B.T. Collins Army Reserve Center (Sacramento).

The California-based Training Center is the first of three emerging CSTCs - two others are expected to stand up over the next few years - one at Fort McCoy, Wisconsin for the Midwest region and one at Fort Dix, New Jersey for the East Coast. CSTCs will be for the Army Reserve what the National Training Center (NTC) and Joint Readiness Training Center (JRTC) is for the Active Army.

The CSTC-West is a U.S. Army installation under the command and control of the U.S. Army Installation Management Command-West (IMCOM-W), based at Fort Sam Houston, Texas, with operational control by the U.S. Army Reserve Command (USARC) in Atlanta, Georgia.
